


IF YOUR PRODUCT CONTAINS THESE INGREDIENTS,
YOU MUST VERIFY THEIR SOURCE BEFORE POSTING



VINEGAR . ACETIC ACID



If vinegar source is specified in the ingredients label, then there is no need to verify source of vinegar. **For example:** apple cider vinegar, white whine vinegar, balsamic vinegar, rice vinegar, etc.

FOOD STARCH · DEXTRIN · MALTODEXTRIN

Food starch (also modified food starch), dextrin, and maltodextrin – can be produced from both Chametz and Kitniyot ingredients.

Please verify source of these ingredients with manufacturer before posting product.

If ingredient source is specified in the ingredients label, then there is no need to verify source. **For example:** wheat, corn, potato, tapioca, etc.





Vanilla – also vanilla extract – is often made with alcohol can be produced from both Chametz and Kitniyot ingredients. Please verify source with manufacturer <u>before</u> posting product.

ALCOHOL



Alcohol, as a food ingredient, can be produced from both Chametz and Kitniyot ingredients. Please verify source of alcohol with manufacturer <u>before</u> posting product.

A reminder: it is the Rabbi's policy <u>not</u> to approve of alcoholic beverages even during the year. You are welcome to consult with the lists provided by other agencies to determine the Kashrut status of alcoholic beverages.

YEAST

Se'or, which is prohibited for consumption on Pesach, does not refer to modern yeast. However, yeast is a microorganism propagated on various media which can complicate it's Kashrut status for Pesach.

Therefore, though they may not actually contain Chametz, we do not research products which contain yeast in them.
